### **About this Course**

Evidence based medical, developmental and outcome data will be discussed to inform treatment, best practices, and management of the medically fragile NICU child.

### **Learning Objectives**

- Choose rehabilitative interventions to support the premature infant in the NICU
- Determine which evidence-based assessment tool would be most appropriate to evaluate an infant's motor developmental status
- Identify positioning needs within a therapeutic intervention plan with the post NICU infant and their family/caregiver
- Select handling techniques to promote postural control in static and dynamic positions
- Determine the rationale for the selection of a therapeutic intervention plan of care with a post NICU infant and their family/caregiver
- Evaluate the need for developmental follow-up, family intervention, and positioning and handling programming for NICU graduates
- Apply an evidence-based recommendation for follow-up care of an infant and family/caregiver after discharge from the NICU
