- Apply assessment and treatment strategies to treat the flexible bony misalignment.
- Relate upper cervical spine alignment to tight oral tissues.
- Apply interventions to improve postural symmetry in a child with torticollis to facilitate improved feeding, participation in play, and/or functional mobility.
